Next Monday the Principals have an Auckland wide paid union meeting. There is a proposal for industrial action on the 22nd August for Primary School Principals.

## **OUT OF SCHOOL CARE SUBSIDY**

The OSCAR (Out of School Care and Recreation) Subsidy is for children aged 5 to 13 years. It helps towards the costs of before-school and afterschool care for up to 20 hours a week, and school holiday programmes for up to 50 hours a week.

You may be able to get this subsidy if you're:

- working, (depending on salary threshold of household), studying or on an approved training course, or;
- involved in an activity that Work and Income has asked you to do, or
- a shift worker who works nights, or
- seriously ill or disabled, or
- caring for a child in hospital or for a child you get the Child Disability Allowance for.

SKiDS staff are happy to talk with you about your options when you apply for a subsidy. If you get the OSCAR Subsidy during the year, they will send you a form before the end of each school term to ask about your childcare needs for the school holidays and the next term. They can also apply for more hours during the holidays.

If you need the OSCAR Subsidy just for the school holidays, applications must be completed before each holiday commences.

A reminder a SKiDS staff member is happy to help you complete the paper work and apply for the subsidy.

SKiDS provide before and after school care for students at Puhinui School during term time. You can collect a programme from the office or see a SKiDS staff member before, or after school in the Tech Room.
