Dear Parents and Caregivers,

<u>WELCOME BACK</u>: To all our families and students, welcome back to school for the last term of the year. We hope you were able to spend some time with your children and family members during the school break. We have had a very good start to Term 4, with students returning and straight into learning. This is a 9 week action packed term. It is always an exciting term mixed in with a little bit of sadness as we farewell our Year 6 students at the end of the term. We hope they have an amazing last term here at Puhinui School.

**BAND CONCERT:** In week 2, October 24th at 6 p.m. the school Year 6 band will be performing at the Vodafone Events Centre in Manukau. This will be a combined performance with the Papatoetoe Schools who are part of the Tironui Trust School Bands. The students in the school band work hard learning throughout Year 5 and Year 6. They receive free tuition from the Tironui Trust tutors. This is an exciting opportunity for them to perform for parents and whanau. Tickets are on sale now for \$5 from the school office. All family members are welcome to attend. Year 5 band members and their families are also welcome. We would love to see you at the concert, a full house would be an amazing experience for the students.

<u>CHOIR CONCERT</u>: In week 3, Thursday 1st November, our gold medal winning choir will be performing for parents and whanau in the School Auditorium. This will start at 6.30 p.m. We hope you are able to attend. There will be a gold coin donation entry and at intermission, a cake stall where baked goods will be for sale. All proceeds going to 'NZ Heart Kids' charity foundation.

**LABOUR DAY, MONDAY 22nd, NO SCHOOL:** A friendly reminder, next Monday, 22nd October is Labour Day. This is a public holiday and school will be closed for the day. School will be reopen on Tuesday 23rd at the normal time of 8.50 .a.m.

<u>HATS COMPULSORY IN TERM 4</u>: Please ensure your child is wearing their school hat this term. If you are a new family to Puhinui School, you should have received an invitation to the mihi whakatau. This will begin at 9.10 a.m. in the auditorium tomorrow (Friday). All whanau meet in the staffroom and students go to class to start the day and for marking of the attendance register.

**ATHLETICS DAY WEEK 3:** On Tuesday 30th October we have our school athletics day starting at 9.30 a.m. This is always one of our most exciting school wide events.
