Kia ora Parents and Whānau,

Nau mai, Haere mai! hello, As-salām 'alaykum, Namaste, Nǐ hǎo, Chào bạn, Musta, Noa'ia, Hola, Mauri, Ni sa bula vinaka, Fakaalofa lahi atu, Tālofa, Mālō e lelei, Mālō nī, Talofa lava, and Kia orana, greetings.

<u>PLEASE REMEMBER, SCHOOL IS OPEN FOR ALL STUDENTS:</u> We are open for all students who are well. We do want to maintain safety and continue to provide the best learning opportunities possible for your child.

THE COVID 19 SPIKE: This week has been a much more settled week at school, with our fewest covid cases for several weeks. We are not sure if we are over the worst of the spike with Omicron, but we are hoping that things continue the way they have this week. In total, this year we have had 99 student positive cases (February 2 - March 10). This week we have seen a continuing decrease in confirmed positive cases each day. Please continue calling and advising us if your child tests positive, or is a household contact. In terms of teaching staff and support staff we have had 12 positive cases this year. Statistically, 90% of Auckland schools are managing positive covid cases. Yesterday across Auckland schools there were 8533 reported positive cases. 870 of these were teachers. On a positive note, the majority of positive cases come from contact outside of schools. We also appear to be dropping in reported cases across Auckland schools, a further positive sign that will hopefully continue.

Please also be aware that we are monitoring and rapid testing staff members as the need arises to continue working on being as proactive as possible. To help manage staffing over the last few weeks we have had to, at various times manage our relieving staff and split classes. We thank you for your understanding and supporting us as we do our best to manage Covid-19 and maintain learning as best we can for all tamariki.

<u>7 DAY ISOLATION:</u> Changes to the self isolation procedures will take effect from Friday 11 March at midnight. This will mean a person who is positive for Covid-19, will now only self isolate for 7 days. Household contacts isolate for 7 days, and test on day 3 and 7. If they have a negative day 7 test and have no symptoms, they can return to school on day 8.

ROLL RETURN: Please read this carefully, this time of the year is usually a busy time for submitting documentation through to the Ministry of Education (MOE). On the first of March our roll return was submitted. The roll return informs the MOE of students on our current roll. It includes any students on the roll, those who have been attending and those who are showing non attendance. For students who have not returned to school, our teachers follow-up with whānau. For students who have not attended school for 20 days are taken off the roll. Families will need to re-enrol their children if they have been taken off our roll. For whānau out of zone, this may mean you will have to enrol at the school you are in zone for.

FINANCE AUDITING: Our 2021 finances are currently being audited to ensure our accountancy practices are tidy and meet expected regulations for schools. Thank you to our finance team who do an excellent job of ensuring we are maintaining the highest level of accountancy procedures.

<u>CHARTER:</u> Our 2022 school charter has been submitted to the MOE and will soon be available on our website. The charter includes our strategic focus areas for 2022 and our 3 year long term strategic plans from 2022 to 2024. Our strategic focuses this year are:

- Curriculum mapping
- Reading Programmes
- Personal life habits which is an aspect of our Puhinui Student profile

Our 2022-2024 Strategic Plans include 3 goals

- 1. Deliver a Puhinui worthy curriculum, one that provides students with authentic, relatable and motivational learning experiences.
- 2. Providing reading programmes at Puhinui School that are well established upon literacy foundations. They support effective delivery in literacy and in reading proficiency of students.
- 3. Provide an environment that enhances learning and our Puhinui identity.

SENIOR SCHOOL OUTDOOR ED WEEK: Next week our seniors will be involved in our traditional outdoor education week activities. It includes a wide range of activities in and out of school. We are really pleased that we have been able to go ahead with outdoor ed week for the students despite the distractions and adjustments we have had to make due to Covid-19.
