<u>DIGITAL LEARNING FROM HOME:</u> We hope tamariki and whānau are settling into a routine this week and accessing learning online with minimal difficulties.

This is a short update from our last newsletter:

From Monday new learning will be posted online for students. A reminder there is a lot of learning available and we encourage you to explore the most relevant learning for your children. Each team has selected a range of learning opportunities across the curriculum. You may also feel like exploring some of the learning at other levels of the school as well, we are happy for you to do this. Next week we have a more deliberate differentiation of learning. We will also have more videos for students to watch to support them in maths and science.

Teachers are preparing next week's work now. Our teams will also begin preparations for mathematic and science based videos for learning in Week 6 as well. 
