PASIFIKA DAY: On Friday the 21<sup>st</sup> of October, we held our Pasifika Day where all of our middle and senior school classes were involved in Pasifika activities, discussions, art work and dance, to acknowledge and celebrate the culture of our students from the Pacific Islands. At the end of the Pasifika day, all of our classrooms shared their focus with a middle and senior school assembly. <u>DIWALI DAY CELEBRATIONS</u>: We are very mindful of the huge contribution that our Indian students make to the overall culture of Puhinui School. Puhinui School has numerous cultures, which makes it the rich, diverse school, that it is. The value of respect ensures that all people at Puhinui School are valued and treated appropriately at all times.

TIRONUI TRUST CONCERT: On Tuesday evening, the 25<sup>th</sup> of October, our Year 5 and 6 bands combined with other Papatoetoe schools, which belong to The Tironui Trust organisation, performed at the Vodafone Events Centre. The Trust provides tutors and music teachers to work in the schools, teaching both string and wind instruments. The concert was massive with more than 150 musicians playing in respective bands. Congratulations to both the Puhinui school bands for their outstanding performances. The number of students involved in the Trust's programme has increased significantly since the first band was formed 10 years ago, at Papatoetoe West School and then Puhinui School the following year.

SCHOOL LEADERSHIP 2017: After 25 years as Principal and 7 years as the Deputy Principal at this school, I am retiring at the end of this year. I have thoroughly enjoyed my time at the school and have seen many, many changes from the 8 classrooms and a total staff of eight teachers, one part time office person, teacher aide and a Principal. On Saturday, our BOT along with an employment consultant appointed a new Principal for Puhinui School commencing at the beginning of 2017. The new Principal appointment will be Mr Mark Elder, a former Assistant Principal at Puhinui School. Mark has had a very long association with Puhinui School over many years and has been involved in developments in management, curriculum, professional development, resources and also property. He is an excellent choice and I have no doubt that he will continue to work with the outstanding staff and senior management team to maintain the very high standards and expectations which underpin the excellent education that our students, attending Puhinui, enjoy.
