Kia ora Parents and Whānau,

Nau mai, Haere mai! Hello, As-salām 'alaykum, Namaste, Nǐ hǎo, Chào bạn, Musta, Noa'ia, Hola, Mauri, Ni sa bula vinaka, Fakaalofa lahi atu, Tālofa, Mālō e lelei, Mālō nī, Talofa lava, and Kia orana, Greetings.

<u>WELCOME BACK WHĀNAU:</u> Welcome back to all our kura whānau for what we hope will be an excellent term of learning for our tamariki. As we are all aware, Covid-19 continues to be a part of our daily living and we will continue to work on managing attendance and staffing as best we can.

<u>MIHI WHAKATAU:</u> In the first week of each term a mihi whakatau is held to welcome new students, staff and whānau. Our mihi whakatau have been in a revised format due to covid restrictions. This Friday will be our first full mihi whakatau for the year, which we are excited to be able to have with our new teachers, new tamariki and their whānau. All new students received an invitation at the beginning of the week.

MASK WEARING: As mentioned in the letter to parents earlier this week, for the start of Term 3, 2022, the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health strongly recommend that all schools and kura make mask wearing a priority for the first four weeks of the term. Our school will continue under this recommendation to make Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 mask wearing consistently practiced for all indoor settings. For Year 0, Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3 student mask wearing is encouraged, but is up to the discretion of parents. This is consistent with our procedures throughout this year. Please make sure that tamariki/ākonga come to school ready to wear masks. Students should bring masks from home if possible. We do have masks available for students who require them.

BOARD ELECTIONS: In September the school Board will be decided through the triennial election process. By now you should have received information in respect to the forthcoming Board election in September. If you have not received this correspondence you can come to the office and request the information relating to the elections and nominations for the Board positions. Nominations close 3rd August at 12 p.m.

ERO EVALUATION PUHINUI SCHOOL: The Education Review Office (ERO) have shifted to a new approach to school evaluation. They will be working with our school on an ongoing basis and supporting the school through providing an outside lens on how effective we are in delivering our strategic planning and student learning. ERO will present a public report within a 3 year cycle for each school. When ERO are ready to report to our community we will let you know. Prior to this year Miss Ansin was working in the Year 5 & Year 6 team. She has done a great job in supporting teachers as our Māori Lead Teacher and in her role as the tutor for the Te Roopu Ahurea, kapa haka group. Thank you Miss Ansin and we wish you all the best. Mr Melroy Romauld will take over from Miss Ansin in Room 22 from Week 4.

We welcome Mr Geoffrey Carter and Miss Annie Robertson to the staff. Mr Carter is the new teacher for Room 2 in a class of Year 4 and 5 students. Miss Robertson is teaching in Room 21 with a New Entrant class.

TEACHING STAFF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT: This week's professional development was around writing. Teachers spent time in teams reviewing our long term planning and our weekly planning. We checked in to see if we had agreement on what our planning documents should look like and what elements of the writing programme we should be consistently delivering on. Miss Garvie took the team through a refresher on how a writing workshop looks, supported by several teachers who role-played students in the workshop.
