Dear Parents, Caregivers & Whānau,

Welcome, Nau mai, Haere mai! hello, As-salām 'alaykum, Namaste, Nǐ hǎo, Chào bạn, Musta, Noa'ia, Hola, Mauri, Ni sa bula vinaka, Fakaalofa lahi atu, Tālofa, Mālō e lelei, Mālō nī, Talofa lava, and Kia orana.

SCHOOL BREAK: This Friday is the last day of Term 1. Thank you for your continued support in a stop start term. We feel like we are now back on track and we hope that Term 2 is Covid free so we can continue to focus on building upon the learning that we have begun. We hope all whānau enjoy the opportunity to spend the holidays with their children. We return to school on Monday 3rd May, at the usual time of 8.50 a.m. A reminder to please ensure your children are on time and ready for the beginning of Term 2.

ANZAC DAY 25 APRIL: Many families take the time to visit ANZAC ceremonies on the 25th April. It is an important time for our country and for children to learn about the meaning of ANZAC. When we return to school after the break we will recognise and remember ANZACs in a special morning gathering. Over the week students will be involved in learning tasks based around ANZAC in the classrooms.

<u>MIHI WHAKATAU:</u> On Friday our first week back to school we will have our new students and whānau welcome to Puhinui School. For those parents with new children to our school, you will receive an invitation to the mihi whakatau.

INTERNATIONAL DAY: Last week we had our International Day to help celebrate the various cultures of our school and our country. Students looked great in the range of cultural clothes they wore. They participated in a range of cultural activities during class time and in class rotations. We hope children were able to enjoy, learn and know that as a country, New Zealand embraces our cultural diversity and we look at the positive uniqueness in others and ourselves.

ROAD SAFETY AND TRAVEL AROUND PUHINUI SCHOOL: Thank you to parents for an improved response to our request in road safety. If we keep thinking of others, being patient and following the rules we will keep the students safe around our school roads, streets and in the drop-off zone. In the coming months we will be making adjustments and upgrades to our drop off zone to further manage safety for students. This will include dropping the zone speed from 10km to 5km. We are looking at making the exit a left turn only and installing kerb barriers to prevent cars riding on or over the verge. Please continue to travel slowly and park sensibly.

<u>PARENT CONFERENCES:</u> Our parent conferences were well attended last Wednesday. Thank you to all parents who were able to attend. Teachers have been following up with families that they didn't manage to see and arranging a time or talk with you. Conferences are a valuable time for teachers. It gives them an opportunity to meet and make connections with each student's home life and their parents. Teachers enjoy the opportunity and appreciate the support our parents provide. Together we educate and nurture the tamariki of Puhinui School.
